Gratitude is a spiritual act

Listening to God's word, Christ's disciples from the early centuries of Christianity felt that gratitude was much more than just a matter of etiquette or a sign of good manners. Giving thanks, the ability of a person to thank the one from whom they received a gift, is a profound spiritual act. Gratitude changes a person, expands their heart, enables them to return to the source of the blessing, and thus receive much more than they did at first.

When a person thanks God for the gifts they have received, it is as if they are returning to the source, which wants to pour out even more gifts and blessings on them than it did at the beginning. They find their way to the One who constantly wants to give them gifts, who wants to give them not just one thing, but everything.

When we express our gratitude to someone, we are telling that person that we needed them. This is a kind of act of humility, because a proud person will never admit their dependence on someone else. Therefore, a grateful soul is capable of melting the hardest heart, while an ungrateful one can push anyone away.

"Eucharist" means 'thanksgiving'

Prayer of thanksgiving, gratitude to God, is the highest form of Christian prayer. We often hear the word "Eucharist," the communion of the Body and Blood of our Savior. "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving," "gratitude."

We have gathered for a common prayer of thanksgiving to the Lord. The thanksgiving to God expressed by the Church makes God's saving action present and makes man's ability to draw from the eternal source vividly present. The priest solemnly calls the people of God to this thanksgiving when he proclaims before the anaphora of the Liturgy: "Lift up your hearts! Let us give thanks to the Lord!" Here, before our eyes, Christ makes his sacrifice on the cross present in a bloodless way through the power and action of the Holy Spirit. He now wants to give us not only what he has for us, but also who he is for us; he wants to give us himself in his Body and Blood in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Therefore, in reality, gratitude to God saves a person, resurrects them, renews the

strength of those who are exhausted, and fills with life those who are dying.

Let gratitude become an integral part of your essence, character, and soul. And may your life always be filled with things for which you are so grateful.
