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The Gospel we are reading today depicts the prayer of the tax collector, which drew God's mercy upon him. This prayer consisted of the following few words: God, be merciful to me, a sinner (Luke 18:13).

Why did the tax collector not choose some majestic and moving psalm to pour out his heart before God, but resorted to such a short prayer, repeating it throughout the entire service? We answer by borrowing the answer from the Holy Fathers. "When true repentance stirs in the soul when humility and contrition appear in it because of the sinfulness that has been revealed to its eyes, then verbosity becomes unnatural and impossible for it. Focusing within herself, directing all her attention to her miserable condition, she begins to cry out to God with some kind of very short prayer."

Those who wish to reveal a deep sense of repentance within themselves use a short prayer as a tool to achieve this state, reciting it with the utmost attention and reverence.

The Savior of the world, who approved the prayer of the tax collector, subsequently allowed and granted us to pray in His all-holy name.

What is the significance of the words "have mercy" or "be merciful" in all prayers? It is a person's awareness of their own perdition; it is a feeling of that mercy, that compassion for oneself, which the Lord commanded us to feel for ourselves; it is a rejection of one's own dignity; it is a request for God's mercy, without which there is no hope of salvation.

"The mercy of God is nothing other than the grace of the Holy Spirit; we sinners must constantly and persistently ask God for it. Have mercy, my Lord, on my miserable condition, into which I have fallen, having lost Your grace, and restore Your grace to me. Strengthen me with Your Spirit of power (Ps. 9:14), so that I may resist temptation.

Send me the Spirit of chastity, so that I may rise from the state of mental derangement in which I find myself and correct my moral steps.

Plant love for You in my heart, so that I may no longer stray from You, nor be carried away by an irresistible

attraction to abominable sin. Grant me Your peace, that it may keep my soul in unshakeable tranquility, not allowing my thoughts to wander through the universe unnecessarily, to my detriment and confusion, but rather focusing them on self-reflection and from there raising them up to Your throne.

Grant me the Spirit of meekness, that I may refrain from anger and malice, and be constantly filled with kindness toward my brethren. Grant me the Spirit of humility, that I may not be conceited, dream of myself, seek praise and human glory, but remember that I am dust and ashes, a fallen creature, cast down to the earth because of my unworthiness. God, be merciful to me, a sinner!
